# Les Clefs d'Or Japan & Japan Concierge Association Joint Seminar 2024

The 2024 seminar by Japan concierge association and Les Clefs d'Or Japan was held on January 24<sup>th</sup> at Cerulean Tower TOKYU hotel in Shibuya, Tokyo. The seminar consists of two parts and the first part was a lecture by Mr. Yoshihiro Miwa, Professor of Hospitality and Tourism faculty of Meikai University, titled 'DX and Concierge, and the spreading world beyond it. The second part was a talk by Mr. James Ridenour of the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice president-UICH, the chief concierge at Next Hotel Melbourne, about DX usage example in the workplace of concierge.

Professor Miwa's lecture began by discussing the impression that the word of 'Digital' has and how generative AI differs from humans. Quoting the results of survey and common examples, then he talked about the penetration of digital technology into every field around us is causing a major digital transformation D) that is changing people's behavior patterns and even sense of values on a global scale.

On the other hand, he said that the current situation where the digitalization is slow in the hospitality industry so we understood that there are still issues to be solved as the human touch may be thought to be valuable. The core focus is that accommodation is not just accommodation but what we can do through it. From that we learned it is important to identify what is the benefit to be gained and what needs to be



protected, and it is also essential to convey the concierge mindset with knowledge deepen through the real experience, to the next generation that has grown up in a fully digital world.

In the continual second part, Mr. James RIDENOUR reaffirmed our strengths and introduced study cases incorporating into generative AI in the concierge field. Especially the thought of [Hybrid AI] utilizing data based on reliable information and a trust network built up in the workplace rather than using general data, has the potential to connect digitalization to the better concierge services. Lastly, we all participants truly appreciated both valuable lectures.
